n the occasion of the 75th Independence Day of India, I extend my warmest greetings to all members of the Indian community in the UAE. The historical people-to-people contacts enhanced by trade connections between India and the UAE laid the strong foundation for special and friendly relations. The hardworking and dedicated Indian community has earned recognition for their significant contribution to the growth and development of the UAE. We are proud of our vibrant community and would like to reassure them that the Embassy in Abu Dhabi and the Consulate in Dubai will continue to extend all required services and assistance for their safety, well-being and progress, including in a post-pandemic scenario.

The provision of free tests, quarantine facilities and other medical facilities, and even Covid-19 vaccines to all those in need is an extraordinary achievement. The process of easing travel restrictions on residents that began on August 5 was a very welcome step in this regard. We are hopeful that this will be followed by greater easing of restrictions for return of all other residents too in the near future. We also anticipate that both the Indian community residing in the UAE and also Indians looking forward to travel to the UAE for Expo 2020 would further boost economic activities and business opportunities in the UAE.

The world has changed a lot since the onset of the pandemic. While we are optimistic with ongoing vaccination programmes and resumption of economic activities, it is also a fact that Covid-19 is here to stay and all of us need to adapt in various ways to stay competitive and survive in the new world. Technology, no doubt, would play an increasingly important role in allowing business continuity. Most visible of all has been the use of online platforms for education, corporate and business meetings, training sessions, seminars and even cultural activities, which is quite effective and will continue in the foreseeable future as well. In this regard, Indians must also adapt to the new requirements of business and opt for appropriate reskilling and

upskilling to remain the most favoured workforce in the UAE. We have already launched a few initiatives for blue-collar workers in the UAE in collaboration with partners from the educational and industrial sectors, and intend to enhance such collaborations in the coming months.

The Embassy in Abu Dhabi and the Consulate in Dubai are undertaking various initiatives for the welfare of the Indian community. These include providing free advisory and legal assistance and running awareness campaigns through the Pravasi Bharatiya Sahayata Kendra (PBSK) for distressed blue-collar workers. PBSK also organises dedicated financial awareness camps for the benefit of Indian workers. A PBSK app has been launched to bring delivery of better services closer to the community. The success of welfare measures is not possible without the support of various Indian community associations, Indian businesses and religious groups in the UAE and we appreciate the crucial support provided by all of them.

As you all know, this year, we are celebrating our 75th Independence Day. To mark 75 glorious years of modern India, the Government of India has launched a campaign called India@75 or Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. Modern India that emerged after a long freedom struggle has achieved many milestones in its eventful journey. Let us collectively celebrate these achievements while remembering the struggle and sacrifices of our forefathers. The India@75 celebrations will be a 'Jan Utsav' or people's festival. "UAE and India are committed to raise bilateral trade to pre-Covid levels"

Both the countries are looking to facilitate investments of \$75 billion in the next few years, says **Dr Aman Puri**, Consul General of India in Dubai

How does the consulate plan to celebrate India's 75th Independence Day?

The Government of India has launched the unique India@75 - Azadi kaAmrit Mahotsav – initiative. A series of cultural events and digital initiatives will be organised to celebrate 75 years of progressive India and the glorious history of its people, culture and achievements.

The consulate hosts the largest Indian community of 2.6 million in Dubai and the northern emirates and we aspire to celebrate this occasion with participation from the Emirati as well as the Indian community members over the next two years. The consulate has started organising several events to mark this special occasion such as essay and quiz competitions, screening of documentaries, and art and craft exhibitions. These celebrations will extend through the India pavilion at Expo 2020 Dubai that will be showcasing the rich culture and heritage of India. The pavilion will see participation from state governments, Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) as well as renowned personalities in the field of art, cinema, literature and fashion. A joint celebration will also be organised to mark the 50th anniversary of the UAE's National Day and 75 years of India's independence, showcasing the deep historic bond and friendship between India and the UAE.

What kind of activities have you organised in the past seven months of this year to promote UAE-India bilateral trade and relations as well as to better connect with the community amid Covid-19?

The UAE is an important partner in India's growth, and a gateway to the Middle East and North Africa region for Indian goods and services. India and the UAE are committed to raise the level of pre-Covid bilateral trade of \$60 billion (Dh220.3 billion), and facilitate investments of \$75 billion in the next few years. During the last seven months, amid the Covid-19-related restrictions, we organised an interactive session comprising leading members of the Indian business community from various sectors in Dubai. This was organised



during the visit of V. Muraleedharan, Minister of State for External Affairs and Parliamentary Affairs of India, to Dubai in January. India participated at Gulfood 2021 earlier this year with the Indian Chamber of Commerce, and with support from the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME). Around 40 Indian MSME companies from the agro food processing sector set up their stalls and exhibited their products and services at Gulfood.

Recently, we hosted a business meet in collaboration with the Consulate General of the Republic of Korea in Dubai, and Korea International Trade Association MENA at the Indian Consulate that was attended by leading Indian and Korean entrepreneurs and business professionals in Dubai. We intend to organise more such interactive sessions with other countries in the run-up to Expo 2020 Dubai.

ndia's preparation for Expo 2020 has moved into top gear with less than 45 days remaining for the grand inauguration on October 1, 2021. The four-storeyed India pavilion's handover is expected to be done by the first week of September 2021.

The Government of India has recently launched the official logo and the website for India pavilion.

The logo design showcases the chakra (wheel), reflecting the progressive pace at which India is growing. The logo colours have been taken from the Indian flag, where saffron symbolises strength and courage; white indicates peace and truth; and green represents fertility, growth, and auspiciousness.

The pavilion's website (Indiaexpo2020. com) provides an easy-to-access interface and features states, themes, sectors, events and the corporates participating in the India pavilion.

"India is one of the oldest civilisations in the world with a kaleidoscopic variety and rich cultural heritage. We have carefully crafted information with interest and experience with entertainment and emotions for our visitors at India pavilion," says Pavan Kapoor, Ambassador of India to the UAE.

The India pavilion is conceptualised to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of



India's independence. The façade, which is made up of 600 colourful blocks capable of kinetic movements, symbolises the theme of "India on the move".

The four-storeyed structure is divided into two parts. The zones are identified based on 11 primary themes — Climate and Biodiversity, Space, Urban and Rural Development, Tolerance and Inclusivity, Golden Jubilee, Knowledge and Learning, Travel and Connectivity, Global Goals, Health and Wellness, Food Agriculture and Livelihoods and Water.

Dr Aman Puri, Deputy Commissioner General for India at Expo 2020 Dubai, says, "The World Expo is a global opportunity to collaborate for the post-pandemic economic revival. India is ready to showcase its business, technological, cultural, art, and leadership strength to the world at this mega event and promote the Make in India, Digital India and the Start-Up India campaigns."

The corporate partners for India pavilion at Dubai Expo 202 include Adani Group, ITC Limited, Hinduja Group, HUL, LuLu Group International, Apollo Hospitals, HSBC, Sun Group, Aster, Conares, Daawat, Baidyanath, Kef Holdings, Allana, Malabar Gold, and Diamonds, Petrochem and Sri Sri Tattva.

India pavilion will also be hosting and cocreating leadership discussions, international trade conferences, and seminars to explore opportunities to partner with other participating nations.

At the India pavilion, the visitors will also get the chance to witness star-studded nights, multiple cultural shows, celebrations of Indian festivals and relish Indian delicacies.
